**Notes:**

1. Anatomy and Physiology: Question paper will consist of Section A- Anatomy of 37 marks and Section B- Physiology of 38 marks.
2. Nutrition and Biochemistry: Question paper will consist of Section A- Nutrition of 45 marks and Section B- Biochemistry of 30 marks.
3. Pharmacology, Genetics, pathology: Section A-Pharmacology of 38 marks and Section B- Pathology of 25 marks and Genetics of 12 marks.
4. Nursing Research & Statistics: Nursing research should be of 50 marks and statistic of 25 marks.
5. Minimum pass marks will be 40% for English only and to be conducted as college exam and marks to be sent to the University for Inclusion in the mark list.
6. Theory and Practical exams for Introduction to Computer to be conducted as college exam and marks to be sent to the University for Inclusion in the mark sheet.
7. Minimum pass marks shall be 50% in each of the Theory and Practical paper separately.
8. A candidate has to pass in theory and practical exam separately in each of the paper.
9. Candidate must pass in internal and external examination in each of the paper separately.
10. If a candidate fails in either theory or practical's paper he/she to re-appear for both the paper (Theory and Practical).
11. The candidate if fails can be permitted for admission to next year.
12. The candidate shall have to clear all the previous examination before appearing in final year examination.
13. The maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed 8 year.
14. A candidate must have minimum of 80% attendance (irrespective of the kind of absence) in the theory and practical in each subject for appearing in the examination.
15. A candidate must have 100% attendance in each of the practical areas before award of degree.
16. No institute shall submit average internal marks of the test student's more than 75% i.e., if 40 students are submitted in the course, average score of the 40 students shall not exceed 75% of total marks. (Example of 5 students: A=2, B=20, C=22, D=21, E= 24 Average score = 89.6%. this will not be accepted by the State Nursing Registration Council.
17. Maximum number of candidate for practical examination should not exceed 20 per day under any circumstances.
18. All practical examination must be held in respective clinical areas.
19. One internal and one external should jointly conduct practical examination for each student.
20. An examiner should be a lecturer or above in a college of nursing with M.Sc (N) in concerned subject and minimum of 3 years of teaching experience in the collegiate program. To be an examiner for nursing foundation course faculty having M.Sc (N) with any specialty shall be considered.
21. On completion of internship, internal assessment out of 100 marks should be sent to the University for Inclusion in the mark sheet.
22. Final year examination result shall be withheld till the candidate complete required attendance for practical and internship.



## Notes:

1. Anatomy and Physiology – Question paper will consist of Section-A Anatomy of 37 marks and Section-B Physiology should be of 38 marks
2. Nutrition and Biochemistry – Question paper will consist of Section A Nutrition of 45 marks and Section-B of Biochemistry of 30 marks
3. Pharmacology, Pathology & Genetics Question Paper will consist of – Section-A of Pharmacology with 38 marks, Section-B of Pathology of 25 and Section –C :Genetics with 12 marks
4. Nursing Research & Statistics Question paper consist of Section - A : Nursing Research of 50 marks and Section – B : Statistics of 25 marks
5. For Papers III, IX , XIII, XIV, XV, XVI, & XVII and the respective practical papers i.e Practical Papers I, II, III, IV, V, VI & VII Minimum pass mark of 50 % to be obtained separately in each theory and practical paper for securing pass in the subject concerned.
6. Minimum pass marks shall be 40 % for Paper – VI : English only
7. Examinations (Theory and Practical as applicable) for Introduction to computers & English to be conducted as college examination and marks to be sent to the University for inclusion in the marks sheet
8. Minimum pass marks will be 50 % in all Theory and Practical papers **separately** except Paper – VI : English (Read Note No.6)
9. In Case of combined subject examinations as in Paper – I, Paper – II, Paper – X & XVIII. Minimum 50 % pass mark to be obtained as the combined score of sections under the paper. And a separate pass in each section is not needed as a single entry of marks will be made in the DMC against the name & Number of the paper.
10. A candidate must have minimum of **80 %** attendance (irrespective of the kind of absence) in Theory and Practical in each subject for appearing for examination
11. A candidate must have 100 % attendance in each of the practical areas before the award of degree
12. A candidate has to pass in theory and practical exam separately in each paper. If a candidate fails in either theory or the practical paper he/she has to re-appear for both the papers i.e. Theory and Practical papers.
13. No institution shall submit average internal marks of the test students more than 75% i.e., if 40 students are admitted in a course, the average score of the 40 students shall not exceed 75% of the total internal marks. (Example of 5 students: A=2, B=20, C=22, D=21, E=24 average score=89.6%). This will not be accepted by the State Nursing Registration Council.
14. The candidate if fails can be permitted for admission to next year.
15. Candidate shall not be admitted to the subsequent higher examination unless the candidate has passed the previous examination
16. The maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed 8 years
17. Maximum number of candidates for practical examination should not exceed 20 per day
18. All practical examinations must be held in the respective clinical areas
19. One internal and one external examiners should jointly conduct practical examination for each student
20. An examiner (Both Internal & External in case of practical exams) should be lecturer or above in a college of nursing with M.Sc. (N) in concerned subject and minimum of 3 years of collegiate / University level teaching experience. **To be an examiner for nursing foundation course faculty having M.Sc. Nursing with any specialty shall be considered.**
21. One External examiner / paper setter will be appointed for each theory paper / Subject / sections (As applicable). For being examiner in the theory subjects the eligibility for appointment of examiners is stipulated separately for each subject along with scheme of examination and question paper pattern.
22. Fourth year University examination to be conducted only after completion of internship.
23. On completion of internship, internal assessment out of 100 marks should be sent to the university for inclusion in the mark sheet.
