4. The term of this Agreement shall be co-terminus with MOU. The obligations stated in this Agreement shall survive for perpetuity post termination or expiration of this Agreement. Upon the request of the Discloser all records, any compositions, articles, documents and other items which contain, disclose and/or embody any Confidential Information (including, without limitation, all copies, reproductions, summaries and notes of the contents thereof), regardless of the person causing the same to be in such form, shall be returned to Discloser or destroyed by the Recipient, and the Recipient will certify that the provisions of this paragraph have been complied with.

5. The Recipient will use at least the same care, but no less than reasonable care, to avoid disclosure of the Discloser's Confidential Information as it uses with its own Confidential Information and will use the Discloser's Information only for the purpose for which it was disclosed.

(Google and the University are hereinafter collectively referred to as "Parties" and individually as "Party" unless the context requires otherwise.)

INTRODUCTION

- A. University wishes to implement technical solutions and educational digital literacy initiatives and programs.
- B. Google wishes to promote and support education and digital literacy in University's region.
- C. The parties have agreed to collaborate in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

1 University Programs

1.1 University may, from time to time, wish to implement various technical solutions and educational digital literacy programs by providing training, education and tools in respect of open web technologies and its integration in student learning to its faculty and students (each "a Program"); and requests that Google partners with University to help design a curriculum on tools, training and resources for each University Program ("Google Solution").

University may terminate this Agreement at any time by giving at least sixty (60) days' written notice to Google.
- 2.2 A party may suspend or terminate this Agreement with immediate effect if the other party: (i) is in material breach of this Agreement where the breach is incapable of remedy; or (ii) is in material breach of this Agreement where the breach is capable of remedy and fails to remedy that breach within fourteen (14) days after receiving written notice of such breach.
- 2.3 A party may suspend or terminate this Agreement immediately if the other party enters into an arrangement or composition with or for the benefit of its creditors, goes into administration, receivership or administrative receivership, is declared bankrupt or insolvent or is dissolved or otherwise ceases to carry on business or any analogous event happens to the other party in any jurisdiction in which it is incorporated or resident or in which it carries on business or has assets.

APPLICABLE LAWS & ANTI-BRIBERY

- 3.1 University represents and warrants that it will comply with all applicable laws and regulations, including all applicable commercial and public anti-bribery laws ("Anti-Bribery Laws") such as the U.S. Foreign Corrupt Practices Act of 1977 and the UK Bribery Act of 2010, which prohibit corrupt offers of anything of value, either directly or indirectly, to a government official to obtain or keep business or to secure any other improper commercial advantage. "Government officials" include any government employee; candidate for public office; and employee of government-owned or government-controlled companies, public international organizations, and political parties.
- 3.2 University and its personnel have not and will not offer, pay, promise or authorise the payment, directly or through any other person or entity, of anything of value for the purpose of inducing or rewarding any favourable action or influencing any act or decision in connection with Google's business to a candidate for public office or to an official or employee of a government, government-controlled entity, public international organisation or political party.

The recipient of any Confidential Information will not disclose that, except to group companies, employees and/or professional advisors who need to know it and who have agreed in writing (or in the case of professional advisors are otherwise bound) to keep it confidential. The recipient will ensure that those people and entities: (a) use such Confidential Information only to exercise rights and fulfil obligations under this Agreement, and (b) keep such Confidential Information confidential. The recipient may also disclose Confidential Information when required by law after giving reasonable notice to the disclosure, such notice to be sufficient to give the disclosure the opportunity to seek confidential treatment, a protective order or similar remedies or relief prior to disclosure. 5. Intellectual Property.

- 5.1 "Intellectual Property Right(s)" means all patent rights, copyrights, trademark rights, rights in trade secrets (if any), design rights, database rights, domain name rights, moral rights, and any other intellectual property rights (registered or unregistered) throughout the world. "Background IP"means all Intellectual Property owned or licensed by a party (a) before the Effective Date of this Agreement; or (b) independent of this Agreement.
- 5.2 Except for the any license rights which might be specifically granted hereunder, neither party will own or acquire any right, title, or interest to the other party's Background IP under this Agreement. All Intellectual Property Rights comprised, subsisting or developed in conjunction with or as a result of a Google Solution (including without limitation, any materials, documents, data, hardware and software provided by Google) shall vest in and belong absolutely to Google.
- 5.3 Without limitation, any use by University of Google's Trademarks (whether in relation to the Program or otherwise), is subject to Google's prior written consent. University agrees to notify Google of any unauthorized use of the Google Trademarks by others promptly as it comes to University's attention. University will not take any action which may suggest or imply that Google has endorsed University, the Program or any product or service of University, or that there is any connection or relationship between Google and University.

For purposes of this Agreement, "Google Trademarks" means all Google brand designations, including without limitation names, marks, logos and trade dress, and any other brand designations used by Google in connection with Google's products and services. - 10.12 Severability. If any term (or part of a term) of this Agreement is invalid, illegal or unenforceable, the rest of the Agreement will remain in effect.
- 10.13 Governing Law. This Agreement is governed by California law, excluding California's choice of law rules. FOR ANY DISPUTE ARISING OUT OF OR RELATING TO THIS AGREEMENT. THE PARTIES CONSENT TO PERSONAL JURISDICTION IN, AND THE EXCLUSIVE VENUE OF, THE COURTS IN SANTA CLARA COUNTY, CALIFORNIA

Group 2

The other group are following the old curriculum and are 3rd year students. They are about 25 students who are going to have some theory before their 7 weeks clinical practice in different hospitals and old age homes in South India.

Programme

2nd - 6th January 2022

1 week theory - how to write a bach. thesis (I do that, but could do it in English) (its usually 2 weeks, but we have long days and choose to compromise to 1 week)

7th - 10th January 2022

1 week theory – introduction to clinical practice in project management (its usually 2 weeks, but we have long days and choose to compromise I to 1 week). Lasse is in charge of this part of the programme, but would one of your tutors be able to come to Pondicherry and participate in giving classes for the students?

We have a budget of NOK 20.000 which we would pay you for this.

After two weeks theory they have:

7 weeks clinical practice in project management (and four of them Diaconia practice in Pondy). The rest have 2 weeks which they have to stay in India to start working on their bach. thesis which goes over 8 weeks.

As the situation is in India at the present do all the students need student visa for 3 months. If you participate in the theory part in Pondy and are payed for it, could they then be accepted as your students and apply for student visa for 3 months?

Merck has established two labs across the country with one as innovation lab at Merck, Bommasandra -Jigani link road, Bangalore and other the Merck High-End Skill development center in collaboration with CSIR-IMTech ("Development Centre"), a premier R&D Centre Laboratory of the Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (CSIR) under the aegis of Ministry of Science and Technology, located at Sector 39A, Chandigarh. A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR DOCTORATE RESEARCH SUGARCANE BREEDING INSTITUTE, COLLABORATION BETWEEN AND, DEPARTMENT REGIONAL CENTRE, KARNAL (ICAR) OF MARKANDESHWAR (DEEMED BIOTECHNOLOGY, MAHARISHI то BE UNIVERSITY), MULLANA-AMBALA

The Sugarcane Breeding Institute, Regional Centre, Karnal was established as early as 1932 to act as a liaison with the main Institute at Coimbatore, and with a view to securing first hand knowledge about the performance of various Coimbatore seedlings /canes and their parents under the sub-tropical conditions. This centre acts as a prism through which main Institute at Coimbatore observes and evaluates the behaviour of Co canes under the climatic conditions of North throughout the year and the mandate of the Regional Centre are 1) to evaluate sugarcane germplasm under sub-tropical conditions and identify potential donors for characters of economic importance, 2) to conduct inheritance studies in sugarcane varietal crosses for sugar and stalk yield components, biotic and aboitic stresses under sub-tropical conditions of India, 3) to evaluate sugarcane varieties for North Western Zone of India and 4) to produce breeder seed of some elite sugarcane varieties for supplying to sugar mills and famers. This regional centre has several landmark achievements to its credit in Sugarcane Breeding and related research.

At present the centre has a scientific staff /positions with specializations in Plant Breeding, Entomology, Plant Pathology, Plant Physiology, Agronomy etc. These scientists are well trained in their field. Understanding the scope of participation in this program, the Department of Biotechnology, Maharishi Markandeshwar (Deemed to be University), Mullana-Ambala, hereafter refer to as University and Sugarcane Breeding Institute, Regional Centre, Karnal of the Indian Council of Agricultural Research herein after refer to as SBIRC sign the memorandum of understanding (MOU) for jointly undertaking the Ph.D. research work, in the field of Sugarcane improvement, production and protection with the following terms and conditions and agree to carry out their respective responsibilities as detailed in the MOU.

Terms and conditions:

- The following terms and conditions will be applicable to both the collaborating Department of Biotechnology at MM(DU) and SBI, RC, Karnal as specified in the sub clauses below:-
 - 1.1 The admission to Ph.D. program, number of seats in each subject, PG teaching, course work and broad area of research etc. will be the responsibility of the University.
 - The degree will be awarded by Maharishi Markandeshwar (Deemed to be University), Mullana-Ambala.
 - 1.3 If the major advisor of the Ph.D. student feels that faculty or facilities of the SBI, RC, Karnal may be helpful in the student's research, the collaboration of SBI, RC, Karnal may be sought.
 - 1.4 Any scientist of SBI, RC, Karnal fulfilling the qualifications/requirements of Ph.D. supervision of MM(DU), Mullana, on the recommendation of the HOD concerned of Department of Biotechnology at MM(DU), Mullana, may be appointed as co-supervisor in the advisory committee of the student. The supervisor depending upon the topic of research for thesis will recommend the advisory committee to Dean and HOD of concerned department. SBI, RC, Karnal will permit the concerned teacher to act as co-supervisor (Co-Guide) of the student.
 - 1.5 The nature of the research undertaken by the student(s) will be preferably related to the sugarcane interdisciplinary research work on Breeding, Plant Physiology, Plant pathology, Agronomy, Entomology etc. and will be agreed to by the student's advisory committee and Head of the concerned Department.
 - 1.6 Such student will be allowed to utilize the scientific material and physical facilities of SBI, RC, Karnal with proper approval of the concerned authorities.
 - 1.7 The SBI, RC, Karnal would also provide facilities required for research by any other Faculty Member/student of above mentioned disciplines (Clause 1.5) provided it does not hinder the natural functioning of the Institute/University.
 - 1.8 The help rendered by SBI, RC, Karnal will be properly acknowledged in the thesis and any research paper/other publication/award/patent emerging out of the research work carried out by the students in collaboration with SBI, RC, Karnal will be jointly shared.
 - 1.9 The Ph.D Students of MM(DU), Mullana carrying out their research work at ICAR-SBIRC will have to pay a sum of Rs. 30,000/ semester towards bench fees. 
