### INDIA'S LARGEST CLINICAL ADVANCED SKILL & SIMULATION CENTRE

Spread in an area of 15000 Sq. Ft., this state-of-the-art Clinical Advanced Skill and Simulation Centre has been set up to train Undergraduate and Post graduate Medical, Nursing and Paramedical students and faculty. Maharishi Markandeshwar (Deemed to be University) has spent nearly Rs. 200 Million to develop this centre as one of the largest & most comprehensive Medical Skill & Simulation facilities.

The idea is to provide real-time experience to students and train them in the skills for handling complex case scenario before actually carrying out the same on the patients. For this, the Skill and Simulation facility has Adult Patient Simulator, Paediatrics and Neonatal Simulator, Infant and Child mannequins in virtual Intensive Care Units (ICU), Paediatric-ICU and Operation Theatre modules.

The Centre also has facilities for advanced training in Laparoscopy, Arthroscopy, Endoscopy, Colonoscopy, Bronchoscopy, Urological procedures, Angiography and Gynaecological Procedures and Ultrasound imaging with the help of most advanced Simulation Trainers.


# **RESEARCH PUBLICATIONS**

# **RESEARCH PUBLICATIONS**






# HEALTH CARE FACILITIES

MM (DU) has 940 bedded state -of -the- art multi specialty and 200 bedded Super- Specialty Hospital, a Dental College with dental hospital equipped with state -of -the- art facilities, two nursing colleges, one pharmacy college and one physiotherapy college. The teaching hospital of MM Institute of Medical Sciences & Research has been granted NABH Accreditation since September, 2019. MM (DU) is actively engaged in providing comprehensive health care services to local population in terms of promotive, preventive, curative and rehabilitative measures.

All Speciality and super specialty departments are well equipped to provide quality healthcare to patients. The Hospital has most modern Modular Operation Theatres, Intensive Care Complex and general wards. The operation theatres and Intensive care areas are equipped with latest life-saving equipment's like Ventilators, Infusion Pumps, Multipara monitors. There is also paperless e-ICU system functional on 100 ICU and Emergency Beds. Labour room, NICU and PICU are available to provide most advanced Maternal and Child Healthcare services.

The teaching hospital has highly advanced state of the art equipment's like Versa HD Linear Accelerator and CT simulator for Radiotherapy(Only Medical College In Haryana to have Linear Accelerator Facility), Azurion (Philips) Cath Lab with Integrated IVUS and FFR for flow management and Intellispace Critical Care and Anesthesia System(ICCA) for e-ICU, two MRI, 128 slice and 16 slice C.T.Scan, Ultrasounds, 24 hrs Blood Bank services, Dialysis, 24 hrs Emergency Service and ICU facilities which help in providing the latest and the best hands on experience to the students. The hospital has all super specialty departments with super specialty facilities in Urology, Cardiology, Gastroenterology, Neurosurgery, Pediatric Surgery, Nepherology, Plastic Surgery, Cardiothoracic and vascular Surgery. MMIMSR is the only private Medical college in Haryana to have D.M/ M.Ch courses.
